

I'm writing this in April, right around tax time. I think most of us are familiar with the idea of an audit. And I think one fear most of us have is being audited; of receiving a letter from the IRS that doesn't include a tax refund but states that they would like to talk about our tax return. But doing an audit is good for us; when we balance our checkbooks, we are running an audit on our own finances to see if we are in the black. I once read an article written by an executive, who was a follower of Jesus, he suggested that we should do a spiritual audit on ourselves. Below are some of his questions, and some I've added for us to conduct our own spiritual audit.

1. Am I content with who I am becoming?

Every day you get one day closer to who you will ultimately be; are you satisfied with where you are headed?

2. Am I becoming less religious and more spiritual?

The Pharisees were religious; Jesus was spiritual. Too much traditionalism is religious, while a relationship with Jesus is spiritual; which is more important to you?

3. Do I have a quiet center to my life?

Francois Fenelon, who walked with God three hundred years ago said, "Peace is what God wants for you no matter what is happening." Inner peace is the evidence of God's presence.

4. Have I defined my unique ministry?

Do you know what spiritual gifts God has gifted you with? The need is always bigger than any one person can satisfy, so your call is simply to handle the part of the need where your gifts fit.

5. Is my prayer life improving?

One test of our prayer life is this: Do your decisions have prayer as an integral part, or do you make decisions from your desires and then turn to God asking God to bless your decision?

6. Have I maintained a genuine awe of God?

Awe inspires us, it overwhelms us, it intimidates our humanness, and it inspires worship. Are you in awe of God?

7. Is my humility genuine?

As a follower of Jesus our humility is not denying the power that we have but admitting that the power comes through us from the Holy Spirit. Are you a conduit of God's Spirit and power?

8. Do I have joy?

Joy is promised to us, do you have it? Joy is perfected when we live under the sovereignty of God.
